Ms. O'Hara also has developed and trialed patient education materials for high cholesterol that allow clients to receive medically appropriate education enabling the client to improve their management of cholesterol and prevent future disease. S. Coyle expresses her appreciation to the following committee members: Linda Bilyeu, Julie Byzcek, Cindy Whetsell and Amalia Kane-Crawford. The committee members worked diligently to update and revise the criteria for both awards and scholarships to improve relevancy

According to Ms. Coyle, the processes followed included the following:

- Notice of the Awards and Scholarship criteria were posted on the FAPHN WEB site.
- Applications are posted on the WEB site. http://www.faphn.org
- Notices were sent via E-mail to members encouraging participation.
- This year's deadline was August 26, 2011.
- Upon receipt, the nominations and applications went to committee and FAPHN membership verified in the categories requiring membership.
- The committee applied all criteria for each category to each application and nomination before

finalizing a point level leading to final selection.

The FAPHN process, at this point, is to announce to the Board of Directors final decisions reached for each category. The committee members are the only ones to know the selection of applicants. The announcement is made publicly at the FAPHN Annual Business meeting.

HISTORY of FAPHN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Ms. Coyle reports that FAPHN has been able to assist ten FAPHN members (Public Health Nurses) seeking their R.N. to BSN degree since the year 2003. The initial fund in this scholarship began at \$500 and remained at this amount the first seven years. The Board of Directors decided in 2010 to increase the Scholarship amount for each program to \$1000 each as long as the membership continued to faithfully renew their dues and to recruit new members. **Six** FAPHN members (Public Health Nurses) pursuing the Advanced Degree have received Scholarships from FAPHN since the year 2005. Awarding these monetary Scholarships serves as part of the FAPHN efforts to meet the Mission of FAPHN.

Ms. Coyle reports **\$10,000** as the **GRAND TOTAL** spent on Public Health Nurse loyal members since the onset in 2003.

The Awards program *underwritten by FAPHN members* since the onset in August 2003, under the direction of **Stephen Mason**, Director of Community Public Health Nursing based in Key West (until 2005), spent a **GRAND TOTAL** of **\$2,197**.

Diana Coyle took over the management of these two programs in July 2005.
